


# Printable Walking Tour Directions



The Pagoda is located on the southwest side of the Court House Square at the corner of Fifth and Main Streets. (The western part of Illinois Route 15 is known locally as Main Street.)



If you're standing by the Pagoda, look west and slightly north to the center of the Square. That big brick building is the Courthouse!



Directly west of the Courthouse is Entry 4, the Edwards County Jail!

# Printable Walking Tour Directions



To reach the Albion Public Library from the Edwards County Jail, walk east and cross Fourth Street (a.k.a., Illinois Route 130). The library is located on the northeast corner of Fourth and Main Streets. The best way to get to the library from the courthouse square is to cross Fifth Street, then cross Main Street at the Fifth Street intersection. Follow Main Street east to Fourth Street (Illinois Route 130), use the cross walk, then cross Main Street. Happy reading!



John's Episcopal Church is south from the library. The best and easiest way to reach the church, which is listed on the National Registry of Historic Buildings, is to retrace your path to the intersection of Main and Fifth. Before crossing Fifth, however, turn left (south) and travel one block south to Cherry Street. Turn left, the church will appear in your left.




The Washington Painter house is located on South Fifth Street. Walk west down Cherry Street from St. John's Episcopal Church, and the next street you come to is Fifth Street. Cross Fifth and turn left. Walk south on Fifth and cross Walnut Street. Continue south. This block between Walnut and Terminal Streets is longer than most Albion blocks. In the middle of the block, you will see the Washington Painter House, surrounded by a custom made wrought-iron fence. It is a two story house.


# Printable Walking Tour Directions



The rest of the tour is more accessible (and quicker) by utilizing a vehicle. The old Albion Cemetery is located at the intersection of North Fifth and Pine streets. To reach it from the courthouse square, travel on the street to the west of the courthouse. That is Fifth. Proceed north to the second stop sign. The cemetery is located just northeast of the intersection.



From the cemetery, travel back south on Fifth Street to Main Street and right (west). Three blocks down, on the north side, is the Edwards County Historical Museum, which is located mid-block on the north side. It can be reached through special appointments, though the Historical Society meets each Thursday evening.



To reach Wanboro Cemetery, proceed west on Main Street (Illinois Route 15). Follow it to County Road 400E (It is the first road to the south of the 55 mph sign). Turn onto it, then immediately turn right onto County Road 880N. Follow the road approximately 1 ½ miles; the road will bend slightly to the left and the cemetery, which is enclosed by a fence, is located to the right, about 500 feet off the road. It is accessible by an old entry road.
